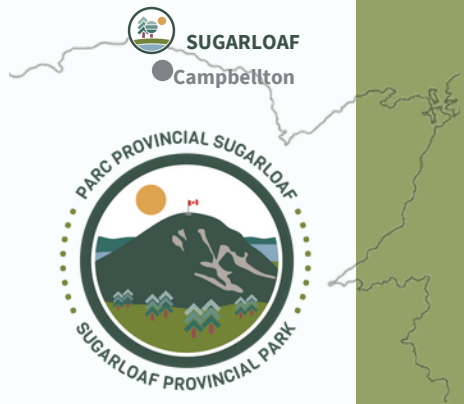
## Overnight Experience
