DIGITAL LITERACY FRAMEWORK

Have you ever heard of the phrase "digital literacy"? Just like traditional literacy or the concept of "financial literacy", the literacy around using digital devices is specific and multi-faceted. Did you know that our K-12 education system in NB has a new framework to help with the implementation of digital literacy in schools? The digital literacy framework, which was written by Matt McGuire (former ASD-W teacher and technology coordinator and current McKenna Institute Fellow at UNB) and further developed by Andrew Colwell at EECD, is now live and can be accessed by all at the Virtual Learning SharePoint site.

Six domains of Digital Literacy



Digital literacy defined is "the harmony of digital skills, attitudes, and behaviors that help learners achieve their goals and become thoughtful and able citizens that contribute to the betterment of society and the common good".

MAPLEHURST MIDDLE SCHOOL VISIT

WHAT IS A SOFTWARE ENGINEER?

A software engineer, also referred to as programmer or developer, is someone who writes computer code (some sample programming languages are Python, Java and C++). Computer code can be written to do a lot of things, from a minor task like automation, right up to the development of large software programs like Microsoft Word or an entire operating system (like Windows). To become a software engineer, a bachelor's degree, usually in computer science, computer systems engineering, software engineering or mathematics or completion of a college program in computer science is usually required. However, there has been a rise in shorter programs, anywhere from a few weeks to a few months, that allow participants to gain training and skills in the form of a "bootcamp" which can sometime be enough to find a job in the field. The demand for programmers has risen in recent years, including here in New Brunswick, with a healthy job market for job seekers.
