
BESSBOROUGH SCHOOL EXPLORES ENERGY

DID YOU KNOW...

The job prospects for long-term care aids are projected to grow over the next few years as there will be a growth in employment, new positions offered, and new positions opening up due to retirement.

There are approximately 6.750 people in New Brunswick working as longterm care aides.

New Brunswick currently has 71 longterm care homes, owned by either for profit organizations or not-for-profit organizations.

New Brunswick's senior population is predicted to double over the next 20 years.

Students in NB can enroll in a LTC Enhanced COOP program.

HIGH SCHOOL WEBINAR WITH JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT ON WORK READINESS




PROFESSIONAL LEARNING FOR HIGH SCHOOL MATH TEACHERS OF FINANCIAL LITERACY RECAP

SUCCESS STORY: USING DIGITAL TOOLS FOR CROSS-CURRICULAR STUDENT EXPRESSION AND PROJECTS

In early January, the Centre of Excellence for Digital Innovation lead had the opportunity to work with teachers Megan Young-Jones and Stephen Stone at Hanwell Park Academy.

Megan and Stephen came to the COE after having received some audio recording and green screen equipment from our partners at Brilliant Labs with some very innovative ideas! They hope to implement project-based learning around podcasting, storytelling, and using the green screen to hit multiple curricular outcomes in English Language Arts and Social Studies.



CAREER PROFILE: PENETRATION TESTER (ETHICAL HACKER)

Did you know there are dozens of different types of job roles and career pathways in cybersecurity alone? A career in cybersecurity requires individuals with strong technical skills, but there is also a need for individuals with other, liberal arts education, in areas such as psychology, sociology, criminology and more.



One such role, that of a "Penetration Tester," is a particularly interesting role. "A penetration tester, also commonly known as an ethical hacker, is a network security consultant who exploits a system's vulnerabilities just like a hacker would. They design new penetration tools, and they also document the test

results. A pen tester is considered a white hat or good hacker. Although they must think like a bad guy, the end goal is to help organizations improve their security practices to prevent theft and damage. Pen testers target traditional operating systems and devices as well as emerging technology, including Internet of Things (IoT) devices, mobile devices, embedded systems and more." According to Lighthouse Labs, "The average salary in Canada for a penetration tester is \$76,195."

THE PEGASUS SPYWARE SCANDAL

A recently posted learning activity that can be found on the COE Digital Innovation website is all about the Pegasus Spyware that was, unbeknownst to users, a sort of spyware that infected over 50,000 prominent figures' personal cellphone devices. In this activity, students will learn about the dark, pervasive, and real threat that all of us, especially those in public life (such as politicians, journalists, CEOs and more) face in a hyper-connected world. When our daily devices, such as our phones, tablets and laptops can seemingly be "hacked" and have spyware installed on them without the user knowing, it can present major problems for the individual, organization, government, businesses or more. Surveillance technologies like Pegasus are "a military weapon used against civilians, and the civilians, they don't have any mechanism to help them in seeking justice," says Laurent Richard, founder of Forbidden Stories and Forbidden Films and one of the producers of the films.

Aimed at high school students in technology or journalism classes, this documentary digs into the nexus of critical thinking and emerging technologies in our day-to-day lives. Students need to become equipped with digital literacy skills to allow them to fully understand the world, recognize threats and disinformation, and to have the intuitive ability to avoid these things. Did you know that one of the six components of digital literacy is "critical inquiry and meaning making"? This component is all about teaching "Learners [to] use and create digital technologies to locate information appropriate to the task by seeking a variety of sources, collect information representing diverse perspectives, systematically question and assess the validity and accuracy of information, organize data by priority, topic, or other systematic schema, interpret information gathered, and draw conclusions based on critical analysis and prior knowledge and experience.".
